3. Presentations delivered by providers - Global Learning Centre (Alisa Cleary), Together 4 Humanity (Ronit Baras), High Resolves (Rachel Hinds) and Asia Education Foundation (Hamish Currie via phone from Melbourne). See attached GCE Provider Inventory document, which informed each presentation. The objective of the Inventory is to improve the coordination of professional support to educate for global citizenship. 4. News/Developments in the GCE Provider space:
 - High Resolves (HR)- developing Young Leaders in China program, partnership with Sydney Opera House (digital connection)
 - HR delivering 2019 Education Summit, Melbourne 2nd August, Swinburn University
 - Asia Education Foundation (AEF) - STEAM program to highlight countries in Asia including PNG.
 - HR and AEF discussions/partnerships with the Queensland DoE.

5. Possible opportunities for provider/member collaboration:
 - Youth Forums addressing the UN Global Goals currently being offered by AEF, the GLC and 3-Day Start Up Program (Nina, GU). BCC investigating Youth Forum Concept with HR.
 - Rich GCE resources created by providers are available both free/fee paying offerings. There is a need to collaborate to get resources to educators.
 - Practical concerns with regional school capacity to access PD – TRS, time and cost, availability of supply teachers. Innovative regional teachers are looking for ways to expose regional students to GCE.

6. Feedback from members about the four provider presentations:
 - QCT: can offer a support role to market GCE programs/resources through website and social media.
 - QUT: sought clarification of the move towards Global Competencies/citizenship.
 - DoE: Languages has provided the initial platform for global citizenship. Expect this to broaden as the DoE investigate how to operationalize support for GCE.
 - The Network is important to enhance understanding of global competencies and collaboration. This avoids 'reinventing the wheel' and could support informing strategic documents with GCE language to gain more traction in schools.
 - Simple elegant solution required for schools to adopt global competencies.
